STANFORD TO HONOR DANIEL PEARL WITH ANNUAL MUSICAL CELEBRATION

Co-presented by Stanford Live and Music at Stanford, free Daniel Pearl World Music Days Concert will feature Stanford students and faculty, including St. Lawrence String Quartet

Stanford, CA, September 18, 2014—Stanford's prized ensemble-in-residence, the St. Lawrence String Quartet, has curated another musical program for the annual **Daniel Pearl World Music Days Concert**, which celebrates the life of the Stanford graduate, violinist and *Wall Street Journal* reporter who was slain in Pakistan in 2002. Co-presented by Stanford Live and the Stanford Department of Music, this year's event will take place on **Tuesday, October 14 at 7:30 p.m. in Memorial Church**.

Joining the St. Lawrence—violinists **Geoff Nuttall** and **Mark Fewer**, violist **Lesley Robertson** and cellist **Christopher Costanza**—will be student musicians of the Stanford Chamber Strings. The program includes Telemann's Concerto for Oboe in E Minor with oboist **James Austin Smith**, Bach's *Ich habe genug* with baritone **Kenneth Goodson** and Bach's Suite No. 1 in G Major for Cello with Costanza as soloist.

Daniel Pearl World Music Days was created in response to kidnapping and murder of Daniel Pearl at the hands of extremists in Karachi, Pakistan. Pearl's family and friends came together to work towards a more humane world, forming the Daniel Pearl Foundation, promoting cross-cultural understanding through journalism, music, and innovative communications. The performance is presented in partnership with the Office for Religious Life and Hillel at Stanford.
